A Half Century of Ozanam House

In September 2017, present and former members of the Ozanam House Trust – as well as over a hundred staff members, families, friends, supporters and representatives of local and national fundraising organisations – gathered to celebrate fifty years since the opening of our first house on Featherston Street in mid–1967. Long–time Secretary Tony Finnigan, Trustee Dr. Perce Bydder and Administrator Eileen Day, amongst others, spoke of their memories and experience of Ozanam, and their shared sense of good fortune at having been able to play a part in the Trust's long history. A plaque to commemorate this half century of service has been erected at both our Featherston Street and Newhaven Place sites to mark the occasion.



New House Upgrades

Renovations at Ozanam are, as always, ongoing. The Trust is currently upgrading the ensuites in Lloyd Morgan House, while plans are also afoot to incorporate a chapel at Featherston Street. New furniture for the large Ryan lounge has been purchased, and this has certainly made the room very comfortable and inviting. New bedding has also been purchased for the bedrooms at the Featherston Street site, and all rooms have been standardised with smart new blankets and bedspreads.



Three New Houses for Ozanam

Ozanam has seen plenty of development since our last update. Most significantly, three new houses have been acquired and refurbished to meet the varying needs of our guests. Bydder and Finnigan Houses (named after long-serving members of the Trust, Perce Bydder and Tony Finnigan) were opened in 2015, specially reconfigured to accommodate families and/ or patients in need of a more isolated environment. Most recently, Riverview House, purchased with funds bequeathed by the Estate of Ernest (Ernie) Newcombe, a retired milkman born on a family farm called Riverview near the Manawatu River, was modified along similar lines. All three were conceived with the goal of adding further flexibility for best accommodating patients and their loved ones, and we are sincerely grateful for all the community and organisational support that have allowed us to bring these new houses into being.


